

Inshore Tournament August 7th 2010

Tournament Information:

Entry Fee & Entry Fee Payout

Entry fee is **\$100 per boat**. No entries will be accepted after 9:00pm on August 6th 2010. There is a guaranteed payout of 50% of entry monies. It will be paid out 50, 30, 20 for the heaviest flounder adult & youth. Trophies will be awarded for the heaviest Flounder Adult and 1st 2nd and 3rd Youth.

Captain's Meeting

Will be held on **August 6th 2010** in the tent at Indian River Marina From **7:00 pm to 9:00 pm**. A representative from each boat should attend the meeting.

Tournament Date

August 7th This is a **1 day** tournament.

Fishing Hours

Boats may leave any port or ramp they wish within the tournament boundaries but not before 6:00am. No lines or chum in the water until **7:00am**. All lines out of the water at **3:00pm**.

Boundary Limits

Boundary limit is **20 nautical miles** from Indian River sea buoy (Green Can)

Weigh- In Times

Weigh-in starts at **3:00pm**. No fish may be weighed prior to that time. Scales close at **5:00pm**. Any fish not available for weigh-in by 5:00pm for any reason will not qualify. All fish must be weighed directly from the tournament registered boat from which they were caught. Fish must be brought to the IRBA scale at the fish cleaning facility in Indian River Marina. You may weigh 3 flounder.

Additional Rules

1. All fish must be caught by rod and reel only. In order to be eligible for awards, prizes & Calcutta's, fish must be caught legally by state & federal regulations.
2. Each boat must prominently display their tournament number while fishing.
3. In the event of a breakdown, you may use an alternate boat after getting permission from the tournament director. Your tournament number must be displayed on the alternate boat.
4. All fish eligible for awards & cash prizes may be subject to examination by tournament directors.
5. Protest committee will consist of tournament director & weigh master. The tournament committee shall have the right to rule and decide on any dispute. Their decision is final and binding in any matter.
6. All boats must weigh their fish at the tournament scale located at the fish cleaning facility at Indian River Marina.
7. A representative from the boat must remain with the fish until the fish has been weighed on the tournament scale.
8. Fish must come off a registered boat. You may weigh 3 flounder and 3 sea bass per day fished.
9. Only one day needs to be fished by one boat to make the tournament official and award prizes. The IRBA director has the right to cancel the tournament.

After entering the Labor day weekend Inshore Tournament, boats may enter any or all of the four added entry divisions of:

- A. **Heaviest Flounder** \$20
- B. **Heaviest Flounder Youth*** \$20
- C. **Heaviest Three Flounder **** \$20
- D. **Heaviest Three Flounder Youth **** \$20

** Must be three fish to qualify

* Anglers participating in this Calcutta must be less than 15 years old. The fish must be hooked and caught by the junior angler.

95% of all the Calcutta money will be awarded.

NOTE: You can only win money from a Calcutta that you entered.

Tournament Director:

In the event of a tie for a first place fish, the first and second place monies will be split. The third place monies will go to the next heaviest fish. In the event of a tie for a second place fish, the second and third place monies will be split. There will be no third place winner. In the event of a tie for third place, the third place monies will be split. For categories that have first, second and third place, if there are no second or third place fish, the first place fish takes all. If there is no third place fish, the first and second place fish split the third place money. If any of Calcutta B categories (1, 2) are not filled, that money will go to the heaviest fish in the corresponding Calcutta A categories (1, 2) that was entered in Calcutta B. If Calcutta D is not filled, that money will go to the heaviest fish in Calcutta C that was entered in Calcutta D.
